Study rooms are a great location for conducting a more focus-oriented research. These study rooms offer a quiet and study-friendly atmosphere while providing a comfortable study space. Some of these study rooms are in the Arts Building, John Paul II library and on designated times in the Callan Building.

Secondary Research

This is a research based on a source that is written based on the primary source. A secondary research is conducted by analysing, discussing or interpreting the primary source of information. For example, if someone is writing a report and quoted a book, this is a secondary research as the book (primary source) is used to support the research.

One of the most reliable basis for a source's credibility is its author. First, ensure that the author does not offer one-sided views on the topic. Secondly, the author should state facts that are supported by a proven research or study. And lastly, ensure that the publisher of the source is established, appropriate and licensed. Don't forget to reference!

Subject Librarians

In the Maynooth Library, they provide various supports such as offering help from Subject Librarians who can provide various information regarding their individual specialised subjects. Subject Librarians offer a link between the Academic Community and the Library to aid in achieving your research information needs depending on which department and topic you need assistance with.
